# **Other Updates:**

## Operational comments and general observations

### Weather and other delays:

Both the multipurpose- and the container terminal in Cape Town were windbound yesterday, impacting operations. In
addition, the container terminal was reportedly windbound from 14:50 on Tuesday to Thursday morning, just after
midnight. As a result, the terminal approached operations slowly and cautiously where possible.
