Bottlenecks: <ul style="list-style-type: none">The vessels at anchorage at the Port of Cape Town are causing concern within the industry as there are currently 10 vessels waiting outside. Additional vessel arrivals could see this number increase to 11 vessels by tomorrow. At the same time, berthing delays are captured at nine days and are anticipated to increase even further if vessels are not adequately serviced.
