Other Updates:

Operational comments and general observations

Weather and other delays:

- The MSC Anusha was delayed in Cape Town for approximately three hours over the latest 24 hours due to navigation equipment being out of commission.
- A vessel destined for Cape Town MPT is being held up in Port Elizabeth due to inclement weather.

Rail Update:

• Over the weekend, intermittent cable theft and vandalism persisted on the rail network; however, a sliver lining appeared as six trains managed to depart from Durban over the latest 24-hour period.

Policy Updates:

- The unilateral decision taken by Transnet to impose operational penalties from 1 April 2023 constricts the allowance for the "balancing" of vessels to load export cargo out of South Africa, resulting in a port operational surcharge of USD50 per container by MSC, which will be implemented from 29 May 2023.
- Engagements with TPT are ongoing in this regard, and MSC has agreed to waive the surcharge should TPT change their stance on the operational tariffs implemented from 1 April 2023.
