Policy Updates:

- The unilateral decision taken by Transnet to impose operational penalties from 1 April 2023 constricts the allowance for the "balancing" of vessels to load export cargo out of South Africa, resulting in a port operational surcharge of USD50 per container by MSC, which will be implemented from 29 May 2023.
- Engagements with TPT are ongoing in this regard, and MSC has agreed to waive the surcharge should TPT change ٠ their stance on the operational tariffs implemented from 1 April 2023.
