## **Other Updates:**

### Operational comments and general observations

#### Weather and other delays:

- Operations at CTCT were significantly challenged over the latest 24-hour period as the network was down from 04:00 this
  morning to 07:00. Additionally, the terminal went windbound for approximately four hours. The strike is also still impacting
  operations at the port, as only four out of seven gangs were available during yesterday's afternoon shift. However, this morning
  seven gangs are servicing waterside and landside operations. Caution should still be upheld as yesterday's morning shift kicked
  off with a complement of seven gangs.
- CT MPT only had one gang available during the night shift but returned to a complement of two gangs at the start of the morning shift.
- GCT went windbound for approximately three hours over the latest 24 hours, while the Port of East London went windbound for an undisclosed period. Minimal waterside operations took place at the Port, suggesting that the wind disruptions could have been lengthy.
