Other Updates:

Operational comments and general observations

Weather and other delays:

The most recent reports indicate that the poor operational performance at the Port of Cape Town can be attributed to severe equipment breakdowns. One crane disrupted operations for approximately 16 hours earlier this week while only six of the usual nine RTGs were available. TPT indicated that they are still recovering from the impacts of the strike and that equipment availability was not in their favour.
