Operational comments and general observations

Weather and other delays:

 High swells and strong winds prevented vessels from berthing at CTCT and CT MPT over the latest 24-hour period. Additionally, CTCT went windbound from 23:30 last night to 04:15 this morning. Despite the windbound period being declared over at 04:15 this morning, winds still persisted at the port, adding to the berthing delays experienced.
