## **Other Updates:**

#### Operational comments and general observations

#### Weather and other delays:

The latest reports from industry suggest that vessel ranging continued to haunt operations in Cape Town as a total of 10 operational hours were lost over the weekend.

#### Load-shedding:

No load-shedding was reported at any of our commercial ports over the latest 24-hour period.

#### **Equipment Availability:**

• The shore tensioning units at the Port of Cape Town seemingly remained ineffective over the weekend as 10 operational hours were lost due to vessel ranging.

Staging Areas Update: No current updates

#### Bottlenecks:

The Port of Cape Town managed to remove themselves from the "Port Congestion Watch" as vessels are practically berthing upon arrival once more. According to the latest reports, only one vessel remains at outer anchorage.

Corridor Update: No current updates

No rail updates were received for the latest 24-hour period.
