Other Updates:

Operational comments and general observations

Weather and other delays:

As anticipated, adverse weather conditions disrupted operations at the Port of Cape Town over the weekend. Over the past 24
hours, CTCT was windbound from 11:00 to 18:30 while the swells were high, between 5m and 7m. High swells at CT MPT are
also causing berthing delays, negatively impacting operational performance at the terminal.

Bottlenecks:

- The reefer stack in Cape Town reopened on Saturday, with stack occupancy levels alleviated to 40%.
