#### **Operational comments and general observations**

### Weather and other delays:

- Average time at anchorage for container vessels as of 06:00 this morning: Cape Town: 107 hours (CTCT: 159 hours, CTMPT: 3 hours).
- CTCT had several challenges over the latest 24-hour period, including fumes on the Bear Mountain Bridge and a roof caving in at A-check's gate 1. Additionally, despite the sub-par operational performance at the terminal, they still found time to facilitate labour engagements, ensuring that at least seven operational hours were lost.

#### **Other Updates:**

- TNPA has published a Request for Information (RFI) for the design, financing, construction, operation and maintenance of the proposed Culemborg Intermodal Logistics Precinct or part thereof and related facilities at the Port of Cape Town.
- In terms of the Port Development Framework Plan (PDFP) for the Port of Cape Town, the expansion of the port requires the development of land parcels near the port to create the additional back of port capacity. Under the PDFP, the Culemborg Precinct is earmarked for mixed-use functionality, which includes a focus on logistics provision to support the port.
