Other Updates:

Operational comments and general observations

Weather and other delays:

- The Santa Clara, on berth at CTCT, experienced ranging for the largest part of yesterday as the terminal only managed to move 92 TEUs across the quay. In addition, strong winds also significantly contributed to the poor performance experienced at the port.
- Continuous high swells are still delaying berthing operations at both CTCT and CT MPT. Furthermore, rain delayed a vessel at the latter-mentioned terminal for approximately 15 hours over the most recent 24 hours.

Load-shedding: No Current updates

Equipment Availability:

Crane LC 4 at the Port of Cape Town remains out of commission with no estimated time of return available just yet. Additionally, crane LC 1 also remains out of commission.

Staging Areas Update: No Current updates

Bottlenecks:

• Operations at the Port of Cape Town remain very slow and below par, as vessel ranging and adverse weather disrupted operations at the port yesterday.

Rail Update:

No major incidents occurred on the rail network over the latest 24 hours.
