Other Updates:

Operational comments and general observations

Weather and other delays:

- Average time at anchorage for container vessels as of 06:00 this morning: Cape Town (CTCT): 158 hours.
- CTCT went windbound for approximately 11 hours and 40 minutes over the latest 24-hour period. At the time of reporting this morning, the terminal was still windbound as winds exceeded speeds of 90 km/h. Subsequently, MPT also went windbound.

Load-shedding:

No load-shedding was reported at any of our national ports and terminals over the most recent 24-hour period.

Equipment Availability:

The spares for Cranes LC1 and LC4 at CTCT are anticipated to arrive today. Thereafter the estimated time of return for each crane should be established; however, the strong winds at the terminal are not helping the technical team's cause. Additionally, the terminal is currently operating with 16 RTGs with two additional gantries set to be recommissioned.
