



## 06H00 13 DECEMBER 2023

In efforts to keep stakeholders informed regarding the Container Recovery Plan, Transnet is providing daily status updates on the performance of port and terminal operations.


As at 13 December 2023, there are a total of 23 container vessels at anchorage and a total of 34 gangs deployed across the ports.

A total of 4780 volumes have been handled at the Port of Durban in the last 24 hours.

The container recovery plan monitoring sessions continue to find ways to alleviate congestion at the Port of Durban which include the prioritisation of urgent import cargo this is done in consultation and support from shipping lines. The recent arrival of RTGs at the Cape Town Container Terminal will assist in a faster turnaround to support operational efficiencies.

The Ports of NMB and Cape Town remain fully operational and indicate no challenges thus far.
