Other Updates:

Weather and other delays:

- Average time at anchorage for container vessels as of 06:00 this morning: Cape Town: 43 hours.
- The CTCT went windbound from around 21:30 last night until 02:00 this morning. Additionally, the MSC Branca has been on berth for about seven days already due to the extensive RTG breakdowns experienced.

Load-shedding:

No load-shedding was reported at any of our national ports over the past 24-hour period.

Equipment Availability:

• At the time of reporting, CTCT was operating with seven STS cranes, 23 RTG's, and 43 haulers.

Rail Update:

- The latest reports indicate that DCT Pier 2 currently has 352 over-border units on hand with a dwell time of 60 days and 40 ConCor units on hand with a dwell time of 36 hours. Rail containers on hand are split as follows: **Point:** 60, **Pier 1:** 14, **Pier 2:** 395, **Cape Town:** 64.
- TFR indicated that intermittent cable theft is still taking place on the rail network; however, the incidents are not major and don't cause extensive delays.
